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Adrian Arias is an international multidisciplinary artist working at the intersection of visual arts, poetry, performance, and social justice. A descendant of the Mochica culture of ancient Peru, he embraces his culture's use of dreams as a transformative catalyst between reality and imagination. This ancestral knowledge is used to connect artists and communities in multidisciplinary and ambitious collaborations that speak to equality, liberation, peace and beauty. He believes that creation goes beyond the result: that the fantastic is always written in the creative act.
